## ENTRY INFORMATION

- Exhibitors showing in both the Dressage and Breed shows will pay the Donida Show Office fee and USEF required fees for **each** show separately. All fees for the dressage show shall be paid to the dressage Secretary and included on dressage entry form and are in addition to breed show fees for riders entering both shows.
- Exhibitors showing ONLY in Open to All Breed classes are not required to be USEF Members **are not** required to pay the USEF Office/Drug fee.
- NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED UNLESS IT IS IN US FUNDS ONLY; properly signed, and in the case of a minor, signed by parent or guardian and made on an entry blank provided by the show. Photocopies of entry forms will be allowed. **ONE ENTRY BLANK PER HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION.** Please photocopy both pages of the entry form.
- Copies of the following exhibitor/owner cards are required with entry: USEF (or Equine Canada), proof of both IFSHA and/or IALHA membership. (USEF and IALHA or IFSHA membership is required of the owner, trainer, & exhibitor or non-member fees will apply.) Amateur/Junior status must appear on all cards to qualify for that status.
- Canadian Exhibitors do not have to be USEF Members if they are members of Equine Canada. Current EC card for owner/handler/trainer/rider must accompany entries for this fee to be waived.
- Non-members of IALHA must purchase an IALHA Annual Competition card which will allow them to show at IALHA shows for the current year or sign up for IALHA membership.
- Entry for IALHA and/or IFSHA horses must be accompanied by copies of IALHA and/or IFSHA registration papers or proof of pending registration.
- **Please check your states Health certificate and current (within 6 months) negative Coggins requirement.**
- Returned Checks: There will be a \$25 fee charged for any checks returned by the bank for any reason.

# General Information

## Facility

Donida Farm Equestrian Center is located in Auburn, Washington. All arenas are sand/rubber &/or Nike footing, with the exception of the Obstacle Driving course, to be held on turf. The covered arena is 100' x 215', outdoor arena is 225 X 250, and indoor arena 70 x 150. Several outdoor arenas are available for warm-up. Stalls are 10' x 10'-12", either portable Chinook stalls or wood permanent. All have full doors with bars. There are multiple warm water wash racks available near the stabling area. A full service concession stand will be available on the premises.

## Accommodations

Camping is permitted on the grounds for a \$15.00 per night fee. Welcome barn provides showers and toilets. No Hook-ups available.

## Directions to Donida Farm Equestrian Center

From I-5 -- Take the Auburn-North Bend Exit (East Hwy 18). Take the Auburn Way-Enumclaw exit (Hwy 164). At end of ramp turn left on Auburn Way. Stay on Auburn way for 6 miles (continue past Muckleshoot Casino). Turn left onto 380th, (landmarks: mile marker 6, flashing cross walk, old building with Coopers Corner written on it, Donida Farm Sign). Go one block, road "T's" take a left (small Donida Farm sign). Go one block, at stop turn right onto 376th (small Donida Farm sign) Go over hill, on bottom at left is private road 168th. Donida Farm signs. This is the driveway to the stable. Donida Farm 16600 SE 376<sup>th</sup> Street, Auburn, WA.

## Facility RULES

- All out-of-state horses are encouraged to check with State regarding veterinary health certificate and Coggins test (within the past 6 months).
- Please leave the grounds in the same condition as you find them.
- Please park horse trailers, motor homes or campers in designated areas only.
- ALL used shavings and manure must be placed in designated bin areas.
- NO changes may be made to the electrical system.
- NO structure or stalls may be altered in any way.
- ALL stall drapes must be flame retardant.
- All shavings, bark or landscaping materials used outside of your barn area must be removed and the area swept at the conclusion of the show.
- The facility's property, building, walls, etc. must remain free of temporary attachments of nails, boards, wires or other foreign items that may result in damage to the building, equipment, animals or persons using the Center.
- DOGS -- If you must bring your dog, Donida has a \$30.00 show registration Doggie fee, and must be paid to office upon arrival. Dogs must be on leash at all times and kept only at campgrounds or trailer area. No dogs allowed in arena area. \$50.00 fine. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to clean up after their dogs.
- Stallions must be attended at all times or securely stabled.
- Lunging in designated areas only.
- **ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING ALLOWED IN ANY BUILDINGS ON THE PREMISES**

## GENERAL COMPETITION RULES

1. 2009 USEF rules shall prevail. A COPY OF FULL USEF RULES IS AVAILABLE ON LINE AT USEF.ORG. Exhibitors are expected to know and understand rules for all classes in which they participate.
2. All Owners and Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage caused by them or their agents to barns or any property and will be billed accordingly.
3. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse or accept unconditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition or entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages. (See USEF Rule GR702)
4. PROPER DRESS/ATTIRE AND TACK REQUIRED IN SHOW RING.
5. CANCELLATION OR CONSOLIDATION OF CLASSES: Management reserves the right to cancel or consolidate classes in which there are fewer than three entries.
6. RELEASE OF RESPONSIBILITY: The Northwest Andalusian Horse Association, IFSHA, IALHA, USEF, USDF, Donida Farm, their agents or employees, show Officials and/or employees will not be held responsible for any accident and/or loss that may occur to any exhibitor or his agent, horse and/or equipment.
7. ALL PADDOCK CALLS ARE A COURTESY. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their horses at the gate at the prescribed time. The management is not responsible for any malfunctions of the PA system and no protest will be upheld nor will any class be changed on the basis of PA malfunctions alone.
8. Hoof black and clear hoof polish are allowed (but not required) in all classes.
9. Refer to the USEF shoeing regulations for your breed which may be found on the USEF website. Toe length/shoe thickness will be strictly enforced. Please note: rules prohibit the use of weighted or caustic substances.
10. Dressage Suitability classes allow dressage derbies in addition to hunt caps. Please see UFEF website for complete specifications.
11. English Pleasure Hunt Seat classes will allow Kimberwickes and unrowelled spurs.
12. Ornamental bridles, browbands and cavesons are allowed with the exception of USDF Recognized Dressage Classes.
13. Cross entries will not be allowed between Pleasure Driving, Country Driving, Show Pleasure Driving and Formal Driving at any single competition.
14. Cross entries will not be allowed between Country English Pleasure, English Pleasure Saddle Seat and Formal Saddle Horse at any single competition.
15. CRUELTY/WHIPS – Cruelty to or abuse of a horse by any person at a recognized show is forbidden. Excessive use of a whip on any horse in a stall, aisle way, schooling area, show ring, or elsewhere on the competition grounds before or during the show by any person, constitutes a violation and renders the offender subject to penalty. Judges will be expected to enforce this rule in the arena.
16. DISQUALIFICATION – Any horse doctored in any way, artificially, improperly, or unfairly prepared or tampered with before entering the show arena will be disqualified.
17. VETERINARY INSPECTION – In case of suspected unsoundness or as a safeguard against communicable disease, all horses are subject to a physical inspection by the show veterinarian.
18. **USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions and opportunity classes; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 9) USEA beginner novice division; and 10) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.**
19. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

20. Please note that the Show Steward and Show Managers retain the right to scratch a horse from any additional classes if they or the show veterinarian determine that the horse is not physically conditioned to continue to show safely.

## **USEF USDF Licensed • A Rated • IALHA , IFSHA**

This horse show is licensed by the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and sanctioned by the International Friesian Show Horse Association (IFSHA), and is open to both purebred and part bred Friesian horses, and sanctioned by the International Andalusian and Lusitano Horse Association (IALHA), and is open to both purebred and Half Andalusian horses. It is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation rulebook and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Each participant in this horse show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the rules of the Federation.

All Andalusian and Part Bred horses entered must be registered with or application for registration has been made with IALHA. Weanlings and yearlings are eligible if both sire and dam are registered with IALHA. Copies of registration papers (in the case of purebreds front and back) must be mailed with entries. Copies of USEF and IALHA membership cards must be sent with entries or non-member fees must be included with entry fee payment. \*IALHA Classes Listed as Andalusian are for Andalusian and Lusitano's.

All Friesian bred and Part Bred horses and horse owners/lessees must be members of IFSHA in good standing in order to compete. A copy of the IFSHA membership card for horse and horse owner/lessee must be submitted with entry. If there are fewer than 3 horses in any class, 1/2 points will be awarded by USEF. Full points will be awarded by IFSHA regardless of the number of entries. Friesian horses must be registered with the International Friesian Show Horse Association. A copy of registration papers showing proof of ownership must be submitted with the entry form at the time of entry. All horses must be entered and shown under their registered names.

IFSHA membership forms for horse and horse owner/lessee can be located on the IFSHA web site at [www.friesianshowhorse.com](http://www.friesianshowhorse.com) under "Join IFSHA." A horse's Equine Identity Record form can be found in the IFSHA "Forms Library" section. IFSHA is responsible for notifying USEF if an IFSHA membership application for horse and/or owner taken at the competition is not in compliance. All horses must have a permanent identification mechanism. Part-Bred Friesians must have at least 50% pure Friesian blood and one pure blood Friesian parent (exception: horses that have competed in any Friesian and Part-bred Friesian Division class at a Federation licensed competition prior to January 1, 2006.) Copies of registration certificates showing recorded ownership or proof of lease and membership cards MUST accompany all entries.

**PLEASE NOTE: The information provided below is not intended to be a complete description of the requirements of each class. Each competitor is responsible to be familiar with and comply with the rules as set forth in the 2009 USEF Rule Book**

## **ANDALUSIAN AND HALF ANDALUSIAN**

### **Halter Classes**

- A. A suitable headstall equipped with a throat latch is mandatory. If a Serreta is used, it must be leather covered or wrapped.
- B. Whips are not to exceed six (6) feet including snapper; leads are not to exceed twelve (12) feet in length, including chain / snaps.
- C. Handlers shall wear either jumpsuits or dress slacks and long sleeve shirts. Tie, kerchief, bolo, brooch or pin and appropriate leather shoes, dress shoes or boots are required. Sweaters, vests, coats, or traditional Spanish (Traje Corte) or Portuguese (Campino) attire are optional. Tuxedos appropriate for evening classes only. Horses to be shown in hand at a walk and trot.
- D. Exhibitors will enter in the order called by the gate person. Horses shall enter the gate at a relaxed walk in the counterclockwise direction. Failure to completely clear the gate at a walk shall require the horse to reenter at the proper walk. The horse shall then strike a trot until reaching the designated position in line, as directed by the ring mistress or judge.
- E. When asked, the handler shall walk the horse from the rail to the ring mistress. At the direction of the ring mistress, the handler will walk the horse parallel to the long side of the arena toward the judge for a minimum of 60 feet. If the handler circles the horse, **no more than two circles will be allowed**. The handler will stop the horse in front of the judge and present the horse to the judge. The horse shall stand square on all four feet, not stretched. A horse is considered not stretched if all four feet are flat on the ground and at least one front and one rear cannon bone are perpendicular to the ground. After examination, horses shall trot away from the judge back to the rail and around the arena to the end of the line.
- F. After completion of individual presentation, the class as a group must quietly walk single file, with whip at the handlers' sides. The lead line must maintain a clearly discernible drape, the handler must not place their hand on the chain or close enough to it in any way restrict natural head and neck motion. The handler may not unnecessarily impede the forward motion of the horse while at the walk. After the last horse has passed the judge at the walk, all entries shall line up on the rail for final placement.
- G. Judging criteria: The emphasis for Purebreds shall be placed on type, conformation, quality, and way of going, substance and manners. For Half Andalusians the emphasis shall be placed on conformation, quality, way of going, substance and manners.

**Best Movement:** Horses are to be shown in hand as they would a halter class. To be shown at a 4 beat walk (showing as much overstep of the front hoof print by the hind hoof print as possible) and animated trot with emphasis on extension. A halter pattern will also be required. Horses to be judged on movement only – not conformation.

### **Driving Classes**

Which driving class you are eligible to enter depends partly on the style of your carriage / cart and harness and partly on which riding classes you also enter. Basically, Country Pleasure Driving allows you to enter Country English Pleasure but not English Pleasure Saddle Seat, while Formal Driving allows you to enter English Pleasure Saddle Seat but not Country English Pleasure. Regardless of which driving classes you enter, you are not restricted from other under-saddle divisions such as Hunt Seat, Dressage Suitability, etc. You can also enter Traditional Carriage Driving in addition to any of the other driving divisions. Please read your USEF rules carefully and consult with the USEF Steward at the show well in advance of the time your class is to run to be sure you have entered in the correct division.

### **Youth Classes**

A **YOUTH EXHIBITOR** is an individual who has not reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

**Showmanship-Junior Exhibitor:** Entries shall be exhibited the same as Halter-in-Hand; however, the exhibitor is being judged rather than the horse. Each exhibitor presents his/her horse and is judged on proper presentation of the horse, cleanliness of the horse and tack and correctness of the exhibitor's dress.

**Andalusian/Half Andalusian Walk-Trot Equitation** – May not show after exhibiting in a canter class. Enter ring at the trot in a counter clockwise direction. Judged on basic position in the saddle and ability to govern, control & properly exhibit horse. Stallions prohibited.

**Andalusian/Half Andalusian English Pleasure Youth (Hunt, Country, or Saddle Seat):** To be shown at walk, trot and canter and hand gallop. Must be brought down to walk before transition between trot & canter. Must stand quietly and may be asked to back individually or as a group. Light hand contact must be maintained Judged on manners, performance, type, quality & conformation.

**Andalusian/Half Andalusian Western Pleasure Youth:** To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the arena. Horses may be asked to back. Light contact with the mouth must be maintained at all gaits. Judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation.

**Andalusian Native Contemporary Tack and Attire:** Exhibitors shall enter the ring in a counter clockwise direction at the trot and shall show their horses at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entrants are to be judged 50% on tack and attire and 50% on performance. Entries shall be shown under contemporary Spanish or Portuguese equipment. Attire shall be Spanish, Portuguese, or "A La Grupa." (See USEF or IALHA handbook for further description).

**Andalusian Heritage (Historical) Tack and Attire:** Exhibitors shall enter ring in counterclockwise direction at the trot and shall show their horses at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be shown under either authentic tack from the period represented or English equipment. Riders shall wear attire, which represents the heritage of a culture, which used and rode Andalusian horses. Entries shall be judged 70% attire and 30% performance.

**Half Andalusian Costume:** To be shown and judged either in Native Contemporary Tack and Attire or Heritage Tack and Attire or Fantasy Attire and judged according to Andalusian costume rules above.

**Vintage Riders 45 Years and Over – Amateur to Ride:** May be shown in English, Western or Traditional tack and attire. Shown at the walk, trot (jog) and canter (lope) both ways of the ring. Judged on manners, performance, type, quality & conformation.

**Andalusian Half Andalusian Versatility Western to English:** Horse/rider will begin class in Western tack and attire, then switch to English tack and attire at judge's request. May have assistants help with tack / attire change. This is NOT a race to change equipment but is, instead, judged on performance in both disciplines.

## FRIESIAN DIVISION

**English Pleasure – Hunt Seat:** To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to extend any gait. Must stand quietly and may be asked to back individually or as a group. Light hand contact must be maintained. In open division will be judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation. In amateur, will be judged on manners, performance, type, quality, and conformation.

**English Pleasure - Dressage Suitability:** Exhibitors shall enter the ring at the trot in a counter clockwise direction and be shown at a walk, trot & canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to lengthen or shorten strides, to halt, stand quietly and back. Light hand contact must be maintained. Judged on freedom, regularity, and purity of the paces, harmony, lightness & ease of movement; lightness of the forehand and engagement of the hindquarters; acceptance of the bridle with submissiveness throughout, without tension or resistance. Horses are judged on gaits, type, and correctness and manners consistent with USDF and USEF rules. **Eligible horses can not have been shown in dressage above Training Level. Horses must be 12 years old or under. There is no cross entry between this class and Dressage Show Hack.**

**Dressage Hack** - Class is open to any horse; however, once a horse has been entered and shown in a Dressage Hack class, that horse may not thereafter be shown in a Dressage Suitability class.

*Appointments:* Horses must be shown in a snaffle bridle with a smooth snaffle bit. Drop, flash or figure eight nosebands and regular cavesons are permissible. Dressage or English All-Purpose saddles are permitted. A whip may be carried. Conservative Dressage style saddle pads are required. Attire shall be a short riding coat of conservative color, with tie, choker, or stock tie, breeches or jodhpurs, boots or jodhpur boots, a Hunt cap or protective headgear. Gloves of conservative color are recommended. Half chaps and/or legging are not allowed. Spurs are permitted. Manes and tails may be braided, secured with thread, yarn or bands. Ribbons or other decorations are prohibited.

*Qualifying Gaits and Class Specifications:* Horses will perform working walk, working trot, working canter, lengthened trot and lengthened canter both ways of the arena. Free walk and working trot on a long rein with horse stretching forward and down to be performed in at least one direction. A rein back of 4 steps may be asked for as a group on the rail or individually in the line up. Transitions into and out of the canter will be asked for through the working trot. Horses will be asked to reverse direction at the working trot. Trot work to be ridden sitting or rising at the judge's discretion.

*Objectives:* In addition to objectives for the Dressage Suitability class, horses should begin to show more thrust (pushing power) and show progression towards a degree of balance and thoroughness. Horse should be reliably on the bit. A greater degree of straightness, bending, suppleness and thoroughness is required. There should be a clear distinction between the paces (working and lengthened). The horse's ability as a Dressage mount is to be highly considered.

**English Show Hack:** Exhibitors enter the ring in a counterclockwise direction at the normal trot. Trot may be sitting or rising at the discretion of rider. To be shown at a walk, trot, canter (collected, normal & extended in each gait) and hand gallop both ways of the ring. Must be balanced and show vitality, animation, presence, clean fine limbs & supreme quality. Soundness required. Judged on manners, performance, quality and conformation.

**English Pleasure – Saddle Seat:** To be shown at a true walk, trot, a strong trot, and a canter. Horses will be judged on performance, manners, type, quality and confirmation. Horses will be judged on brilliant performance,

presence, manners, type, quality and conformation. Horses entered in this division may not show in the Country English Pleasure division at the same competition.

**Country English Pleasure – Saddle Seat**: To be shown at a walk, trot & canter both ways of the arena. May be asked to extend any gait. Light hand contact must be maintained at all times. It is mandatory that the horses be asked to halt on the rail both ways of the ring, stand quietly, back and walk off on a loose rein. Judged on attitude, manners, performance, type, quality & conformation.

**Western Pleasure** -- Horses are to shown at a walk, jog trot and lope both ways of the ring. May be asked to extend any gait. Hand gallop will be required in Open division. Horses are to be reversed to the inside (away from the rail) and will not be asked to reverse at the lope. Horses may be asked to back. Light hand contact with the horse's mouth must be maintained at all gaits. The horse must be ridden with the horse's eyes generally at or above the withers in all gaits. Judged on performance, manners, type, quality & conformation.

**Liberty** -- Each horse is presented individually. The horse is set free in the arena and is judged by its freestyle performance. Music must be brought to the announcer's booth a minimum of 4 hours before the session starts. Two handlers are allowed in the ring to keep the horse moving. Music/Liberty Performance is limited to 1.5 minutes. A TWO MINUTE TIME LIMIT per exhibitor to catch the horse afterwards. The horse must be caught by the same handler who handled it at the beginning of the class. If touched by the second person in the ring, this shall result in disqualification. CD's only.

### ***(OTAB)-OPEN TO ALL BREEDS – NOT USEF RECOGNIZED. (Except Friday dressage)***

**Hunter Pleasure** - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. All horses being considered for an award must be serviceably sound. To be judged 75% on performance and soundness; 25% on conformation. NOT USEF.

**Show Hack** - Competitors to enter the ring in a counterclockwise direction at a normal trot. Horse must have natural action. Elevation and high knee action are not to be emphasized. Horses must be balanced and show vitality, animation, presence, clean fine limbs and supreme quality typical of the breed shown. Soundness is required. Light contact must be maintained with all reins at all gaits. Horses may be shown with a braided mane and tail. Braids may be secured with tape, yarn, or rubber bands. Decorations are prohibited. Bridle shall be light, show type; either snaffle, double (full) or Pelham. Kimberwicke bit is permitted. Browbands and cavesson other than dressage types are prohibited. Unconventional tack such as figure eight, drop, or flash nosebands are not permitted. English saddle of any type is required. Girths of either leather, white web, nylon string or suitable material. Martingales, breastplates not allowed. Acceptable Hack attire is required. It consists of conservatively colored coat, breeches and boots. A conservatively colored hunting cap or derby is required. Formal attire consisting of white breeches, top hat and tails may be worn after 6:00 p.m., or in Championship classes. Spurs, whip or crop optional at the exhibitor's discretion.

**Dressage Suitability** - Open to horses that have not competed in any test at or above the first level. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horses potential to become a Dressage mount.

**Novice Rider, Western Type and English Type** - Open to any exhibitor who has not won 3 or more blue ribbons in any western type class. Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown according to breed type at a walk, jog trot/intermediate gait, and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for the wrong lead; special emphasis on the walk. Judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%; appointments 10%.

#### **Leadline** - \*\*ONE RIDER PER MOUNT\*\* **MINIMUM AGE OF RIDER 2-1/2 Years \*\*\***

Open to beginning riders 6 years and under and disabled riders on mares or geldings. Saddle, Hunter or Stock seat tack and appointments. To be led from the ground by a senior (18 years or older). To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk only. Riders may not be tied in the saddle in any way. Judged on seat, hands and general horsemanship. Suitability of mount to rider to be considered. No cross entry to any other ridden/driven class in this show. The lead person shall conform to proper English or western attire and be consistent with the rider. NOT USEF.

**Open Pleasure, Western Type** - Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown according to breed type at a walk, jog gait, and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for the wrong lead; special emphasis on the walk. Judged on performance 60%; conformation 30%; appointments 10%.

**Walk-Trot Western Pleasure** - Open to beginning riders on mares or geldings. Western tack and attire. Suitability of horse to rider. No cross entry with any other class that calls for a canter or hand gallop at this show. To qualify, horse must have been entered, shown and judged in one of the Walk-Trot Western Pleasure classes in this show.

**Pleasure Driving** - To be shown according to breed type at a walk, trot, and extended trot both ways of the ring. To stand quietly in the line up and back readily. To be judged on manners, performance, quality and apparent ability to give a good pleasure drive.

**Hunter Hack** - To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. At least eight horses, if available, are required to jump two obstacles and gallop one way of the ring. All horses being considered for an award must be serviceably sound.

**Academy Saddle Seat/Hunt Seat Pleasure, W/T/C, All Ages OTAB** - The Academy division is created for students in lesson programs. Academy horses must be school horses regularly used for lessons in a public or private (family owned) lesson program, and *must not be in training*. Open to any breed of horse or pony ("horse") used for lessons. Stallions are prohibited. Horses MUST display the characteristic and manners of a horse being used in a lesson environment. The quality of the horse is not to be a determining factor in the class. Only the rider is to be judged. The RIDER is judged on the horsemanship and ringmanship; the ability of the rider to handle the mount and put it through its required gaits correctly. Horses can be bridled with a snaffle, snaffle with martingale, snaffle with German Martingale, snaffle with draw reins, Full bridle, or bridle with a Pelham or Kimberwicke style bits. Horses using Full Bridles, Kimberwickes, or Kimberwicke style bits, pelhams or any bit that includes a curb chain, curb strap or any other configuration that acts as a leverage device CANNOT use a martingale. In this combined class, the rider must use a saddle appropriate for either Hunt Seat or Saddle seat.

**Saddle seat riders** to wear Jodhpur pants, Jodhpur boots, long sleeved shirts with straight tie. Vests, sweaters, and gloves are optional. No jackets or hats are allowed. Hunt Seat riders must wear breeches, Jodhpur, paddock, or hunt boots, long-sleeved shirt with tie or choker. No riding Jackets are allowed. **Protective headgear is mandatory for riders under the age of 18 and strongly recommended for all other riders 18 & over.** Riders in academy classes may not cross enter in any other class in the performance division at this show and must have only shown in the academy division at any other show. Horses may cross enter in other classes at the show with a rider that is not in this division.

**Walk-Trot English/Hunter Pleasure , Riders 11 & Under – OTAB** Open to beginning riders on mares or geldings. English/Hunter tack and attire. Suitability of horse to rider. No cross entry with any other class that calls for a canter or hand gallop at this show. To qualify, horse must have been entered, shown and judged in one of the Walk-Trot Hunter/English Pleasure classes at this show. NOT USEF.

**Pleasure Driving Pairs, OTAB** Open to horses 3 years of age or older. To be shown according to breed type at a walk and slow trot both ways of the ring. The working trot is optional and may be called for at the Judge's discretion. At all times the pair is to show an ability to work as a unit with evenness of tugs. To stand quietly in the line up and back readily. To be judged on performance, presence, quality, manners, and matching. All pair entries must be driven to a four wheel vehicle with appropriate harness. A passenger (groom) is required.

**Novice Rider, English Type, OTAB** Open to any exhibitor who has not won 3 or more blue ribbons in any English type class. Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown according to breed type at a walk, trot, extended trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners, performance, quality and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride 60%; conformation 30%; appointments 10%.

**Walk Trot Green Horse -- OTAB**. Horses may be shown in any style of tack and rider in any attire that is clean and in good condition. Horses may not have entered in any class requiring a canter prior to this show (may cross enter AT this show).

**English Pleasure -- OTAB**. Exhibitors will enter the arena at a trot and be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to extend any gait and back either on the rail or in the center of the arena.

**Western Pleasure -- OTAB**. Exhibitors will enter the arena at a jog and be shown at the walk, jog, and lope both ways of the ring. May be asked to extend any gait and back either on the rail or in the center of the arena.

**Pink Champagne Class --** See who has the smoothest ride by carrying a full glass of champagne and attempting to walk and trot. Rider with the fullest glass wins! Special awards. **Class entry fees donated to Breast Cancer.**

#### **PHOTOCOPY OF 2009 USEF MEMBERSHIP CARD IS REQUESTED WITH ENTRY.**

A current USEF or EQUINE CANADA Amateur certificate is required for all exhibitors 18 years and over who enter classes for Amateurs. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. This certification must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such certification provided by the Federation. Forms may be obtained from the Federation. Certification will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. An amateur continues to be such until he/she has received a change in status from the Federation. Any amateur who wishes to be re-classified on the grounds that he/she has engaged or is planning on engaging in activities which would prevent him/her from continuing to remain an amateur must notify the Federation in writing. There is no fee for amateur certification for Senior Active or Life Members. An annual fee of \$30 will be charged for an amateur card or amateur certification for an individual who is not a member of The Federation or Equine Canada. Such certification will expire on November 30th. (See USEF GR1307).

**COPY OF ALL MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND HORSES REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY**

**CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES** - The Show Committee agrees to cancel and refund entry and stabling fees on any horses not fit to show providing written notice is given on or before entry closing date of JUNE 1, 2009. After entry closing date and up to 10:00 PM JUNE 18, 2009, withdrawal must be accompanied by an OFFICIAL VETERINARY CERTIFICATE. In such cases, refund of entry fees will be given less a \$15.00 handling fee, but stall and tack room fees will not be refunded. **After 10:00 PM on JUNE 18,**

**2009 THERE WILL BE NO REFUND OF ANY FEES, including classes cancelled due to severe weather or other emergency.** See USEF GR832 and USEF GR912.

**ENTRIES IN CLASSES - ENTRIES CLOSE JUNE 1, 2009**

To appear in the program, entries must be post marked no later than midnight, JUNE 1, 2009. Post entries will be accepted UNTIL ONE (1) HOUR BEFORE EACH SESSION IN WHICH THE CLASS IS TO BE HELD and requires the signature of the exhibitor, agent or trainer ON CLASS LIST "Post Entry Slip" Post entry fee is \$5.00 additional fee per class Management reserves the right to accept entries for unfilled classes at the regular fee except stake and championship classes. The term "ENTRY" may not be used to designate an undetermined horse in any class. Performance classes with less than three (3) entries one hour before the session prior to the session in which that class is scheduled will be canceled or combined unless it is the only qualifying class for a Stake or Championship class. The Show Committee reserves the right to eliminate or combine classes that have not filled (3 or less entries). If an Equitation or In-Hand class does not fill, it may be combined with the next older age group and exhibitors will be notified. In the event a class is cancelled for lack of entries, the fee will be returned and the exhibitors notified accordingly. If classes are divided in two or more sections, horses must be shown in the section assigned. Separate awards will be given for each section, except championship or stake classes in which horses from each section will work off for the championships or stakes.

**REFUSAL OF ENTRIES**

In addition to entries of persons suspended or expelled from the USE Federation, a Licensed Competition may refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer, rider, driver or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude or behavior at a Licensed Competition or towards its management, which management is able to substantiate, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Licensed Competition which management is able to substantiate. (See USEF GR914.)

**CHECK POLICY**

**All fees must be paid in U.S. dollars.** All fees are made to: DONIDA FARM. Checks returned for any reason will be charged a \$50.00 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified check or cashiers check. No one will be allowed to show if a bad check or handling fee is outstanding. Checks will be run through the bank only once. An exhibitor will be notified of the returned check and if not settled within 10 days will be turned over to USE Federation for settlement. Management reserves the right to not accept personal checks from any exhibitor who has had a check returned to the show by the bank. Cash, Cashiers Checks or Money Orders only will be accepted from those exhibitors. Personal checks will not be cashed in the Show Office, nor Canadian money exchanged for US Money.

**BEDDING**

There is space on the entry blank to order bales of shavings at \$8.00 a bale. You may also order shavings at the show office. Shavings will be delivered at three times: Morning, Lunch And Evening.

**STALL CONVERSION & DECORATIONS**

No one will be permitted to disassemble any of the stalls or parts of the barn. To do so will jeopardize further use of the facilities. Check out the stall awards!

**ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT**

All exhibitors must appear in the ring properly attired for the class. GROOMS AND ATTENDANTS MUST BE NEATLY ATTIRED WHEN IN THE RING. See USEF A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured.

Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

**All juniors riding in Hunter, Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation sections, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.**

The Federation (USEF) strongly encourages all riders, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted

and in good condition, and the Federation (USEF), Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for Checking headgear worn for such compliance..

#### **AWARDS**

In-Hand and Performance Classes Trophy to first place and ribbons to six places

In-Hand Championships Trophy & Ribbon to Champions and Ribbon to Reserve Champions

#### **IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS**

Each horse shall have the same number through the show. This number will be worn by the rider, handler, driver or equitation rider in a conspicuous place. Any entry without a number in the ring shall not be judged.

#### **DELAY OF CLASSES**

When the start of any class requiring horses to be shown individually is delayed by horses not ready to perform, the competition may be closed at the order of the judges or Show Committee, provided a warning is issued and exhibitors are given three (3) minutes to appear at the in-gate ready to participate. Where horses compete collectively, a warning is issued and the in gate must be closed two minutes after the first horse enters the ring. Judging must not commence until the gate is closed or at the end of the two-minute call. An official timer must be appointed to enforce this rule. See USEF GR831.

**ENTRIES IN ALL EVENTS MUST BE READY AND REPORT TO THE PADDOCK STEWARD FIVE (5) MINUTES PRIOR TO THE START OF EACH CLASS.**

#### **DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT**

Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, handler, rider, trainer, manager, agent, coach or driver will disqualify the horse from adjudication. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove a groom, horse or rider from the show without being liable for compensation or damages. No item may be used inside or outside the ring while showing a horse except one whip per handler. If whips are allowed, they must be no longer than 6' including the snapper or lash. No appendages of any kind are permitted. One lungeing whip is permitted only when lungeing. *Some breed and/or disciplines may have use of whip division rules that depart from this rule and as such, the division rule governs. (See USEF GR803 and GR149.1).* No material, which could be used to excite or place stress on a horse, will be permitted in the paddock area. The judges have been advised that excessive whip abuse in ANY class will not be permitted and the entrant will be excused from showing. All entrants found guilty of such action of whip abuse will be disqualified from subsequent classes and forfeiture of all entries, prize money, trophies and ribbons. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (See USEF1301.7).

**CRUELTY TO OR THE ABUSE OF A HORSE BY ANY PERSON AT A LICENSED COMPETITION IS FORBIDDEN, CONSTITUTES A VIOLATION UNDER CHAPTER 7, AND RENDERS THE OFFENDER SUBJECT TO PENALTY. EXCESSIVE USE OF A WHIP ON ANY HORSE IN A STALL, RUNWAY, SCHOOLING AREA, COMPETITION RING OR ELSEWHERE ON THE COMPETITION GROUNDS, BEFORE OR DURING A COMPETITION, BY ANY PERSON,**

**CONSTITUTES A VIOLATION AND RENDERS THE OFFENDER SUBJECT TO PENALTY. EXCEPT IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS, ANY STRIKING OF THE HORSE'S HEAD (ON THE POLL AND FORWARD OF THE POLL) WITH THE WHIP SHALL BE DEEMED EXCESSIVE. THE SHOW COMMITTEE MUST BAR VIOLATORS FROM FURTHER PARTICIPATION FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE COMPETITION. IT IS THE DUTY OF THE COMPETITION OFFICIALS AND ANY PROPERLY CONSTITUTED HUMANE ORGANIZATION TO REPORT TO THE FEDERATION ANY PERSON WHO INDULGES IN THIS PRACTICE FOR SUCH FURTHER ACTION AS MAY BE DEEMED APPROPRIATE. (SEE USEF GR839).**

**DRUGS AND MEDICATION** - For every horse participating in any competition recognized by the Federation, a \$15 Federation fee will be collected (\$7.00 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medication fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; (see USEF 208.1, GR407.1, 2, 3and GR208.1 - \$8.00 is the USEF Office Fee)

**PROTEST** – A protest and charge must state the full name and address of the accused and contain a complete and definite statement of the acts which constitute the alleged violation. Precise details regarding a violation of rules are necessary. The maker of the protest, charge or grievance is encouraged to list each Rule and Article number alleged to have been violated. The maker of the protest, charge or grievance must be prepared to

substantiate the protest, charge or grievance by his or her own personal testimony at a hearing or of at least one other witness with personal knowledge who is subject to cross examination, and by sworn statements, other witnesses and by other competent evidence. A protest or charge against a Licensed Competition must be referred to the USEF by the steward, technical delegate, Show Committee, competition manager or competition secretary. (See USEF GR602.2).

**DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY THE RULES** – Should any questions or dispute arise not provided for by the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.

**HORSES FOR SALE** – Horses for sale/ schooling must be have entry/release in show office and pay required fees.

**WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION** – No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a Recognized Competition after it has commenced, or remove them from the competition's grounds, without permission from the show secretary. USEF GR1305. If an exhibitor voluntarily removes a horse from the ring without the permission of the judge, the Show Committee will disqualify the exhibitor and all his entries from all future classes at that competition and all prizes and entry fees for the entire competition will be forfeited. Any horse leaving the ring without the exhibitor's volition is deprived of an award in that class.

**DISPUTE NOT COVERED BY THE RULES** – Should any questions or dispute arise not provided for by the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.

**CHANGES IN CLASS SCHEDULE** - Provided the order of events is not changed, the Show Committee shall have the privilege of calling any class up to 30 minutes ahead of scheduled time. Exhibitors should be ready for classes in reasonable time and may not protest such advance of schedule. (See USEF GR830.2).
